SUBJECT: Department of Defense Care for Victims of Sexual Assaults

The Secretary of Defense memorandum dated February 5, 2004, subject as above, (attached) expresses concerns about recent reports regarding allegations of sexual assaults on service members deployed to Iraq and Kuwait, and directs me to review how the Department handles treatment of and care for victims of sexual assault, with particular attention to any special issue that may arise from the circumstances of a combat theater. I direct that you establish and lead the DoD Task Force to accomplish this review. In this role, you have the full authority of my office to engage, as necessary and appropriate, the Military Departments, Services, Joint Staff, Combatant Commands, Office of the Secretary of Defense, Inspector General of the Department of Defense, Defense Agencies and DoD Field Activities to provide the information needed to complete the review.

The Secretary specifically indicated that the review should address the reporting of sexual assaults, including the availability of private channels for reporting such issues within combat theaters. During the course of your review, you should consider what briefings may need to be given to deploying and redeploying service members.

I request that you establish the task force by no later than February 13, 2004, and that you report findings and recommendations to me no later than April 30, 2004.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE UNDER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE
(PERSONNEL AND READINESS)

SUBJECT: Department of Defense Care for Victims of Sexual Assaults

I am concerned about recent reports regarding allegations of sexual assaults on service members deployed to Iraq and Kuwait. Sexual assault will not be tolerated in the Department of Defense. Commanders at every level have a duty to take appropriate steps to prevent sexual assaults, protect victims, and hold those who commit offenses accountable. I am directing that you review how the Department handles treatment of and care for victims of sexual assault, with particular attention to any special issues that may arise from the circumstances of a combat theater. We are responsible for ensuring that the victims of sexual assault are properly treated, their medical and psychological needs are properly met, our policies and programs are effective, and we are prompt in dealing with all issues involved.

Your review should address the reporting of sexual assaults, including the availability of private channels for reporting such issues within combat theaters. During the course of your review, you should also consider what briefings may need to be given to deploying and redeploying service members.

Please report your findings and recommendations 90 days from the date of this memorandum.
