CATCH Program Overview

The CATCH Program allows adult sexual assault victims to anonymously submit suspect information into a database that will be assessed by DoD investigators at CATCH Headquarters (HQ).

If there is a match, a specially-trained CATCH Program representative from the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program will contact the victim. The victim's identity will only be revealed to law enforcement if the victim decides to participate in the investigation.

To submit a CATCH entry, victims need to contact a Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC) or SAPR Victim Advocate (VA).

Who is eligible to participate in the CATCH Program?

- Current Service members, including cadets and midshipmen at the Military Service Academies and their prep schools, Reservists, and National Guard members
- Adult military dependents
- Former Service members
- DoD civilian employees, if the suspect is a Service member

CATCH Program Eligibility

Restricted Reports

Adult sexual assault victims who file or have already filed a Restricted Report with a DD Form 2910. If notified of a potential match, a victim can decide whether to convert to Unrestricted and participate in the investigation. The Restricted Report will not be converted without the victim's signature on a revised DD Form 2910.

Certain Unrestricted Reports

Adult sexual assault victims who file or have already filed certain Unrestricted Reports with a DD Form 2910 where the identity of their suspect was not disclosed by the victim or uncovered by law enforcement. If notified of a potential match, the victim can decide whether they want to participate in the investigation.

No Report (SRI CATCH Entry)

For victims not yet ready to report or who do not want to report, eligible adult sexual assault victims may submit a CATCH entry without filing an official report of sexual assault through a DD Form 2910. This will be a SAPR-Related Inquiry (SRI) Entry, filed through a DD Form 2910-4. This is critical for warfighters who did not report their sexual assault before leaving the Service.

Information About The CATCH Program





SARCs will provide the needed information so victims can submit a CATCH entry.

The SARC or SAPR VA will explain the CATCH Program and provide victims with a username and password to gain access to the CATCH website. Victims will be provided the CATCH Victim Info Sheet and Instruction Sheet for Victims Submitting CATCH Entries, available at www.sapr.mil/catch.

CATCH entries are anonymous.

If a victim's entry matches another entry or investigation, the victim will be contacted by a specially-trained CATCH SAPR representative, **not an investigator or command**, and the victim will have the option to participate in the investigation.

Participation in the CATCH Program is voluntary.

If there is a match, the victim's name will not be provided to law enforcement without the victim's permission.

Victims may decline to participate at any point.

Even after being notified that there was a potential match, a victim may decline to participate in the CATCH Program. There will be no adverse consequences to victims if they do not agree to participate.

Victims may print out their CATCH entry.

Victims may print or request a printout of their CATCH entry for personal records. Victims may also wish to submit their CATCH entry to the Department of Veterans Affairs as documentation to support healthcare benefits or disability claims.





Information in a CATCH Entry

The top five things for victims to provide, only if already known, include:

- 1. Suspect's name
- 2. Suspect's phone number or social media username(s)
- 3. Suspect's rank
- 4. Date of the offense
- 5. Location of the offense

Victims may provide as much information as they remember and feel comfortable sharing.

Digital photos may also be submitted with entries.

Victims must complete only one field to be able to submit an entry; however, the more information provided, the more useful to investigators.

CATCH A Serial Offender Program Sample Form

Background: Congress has directed that the Department of Defense (DoD) set up a database where adult sexual assault victims can provide information anonymously to enable DoD to identify serial sexual offenders.

Purpose: Provide adult sexual assault victims, who file a Restricted Report, an eligible Unrestricted Report, or no report, with a mechanism to provide information to the CATCH program in order to identify individuals who are suspected of perpetrating multiple sexual assaults.

Note: This is a sample form to be provided to the victim to allow them to become familiarized with the suspect and incident details collected by the CATCH program. Only one field is needed to submit an entry, however the more information that is provided the more likely the CATCH program will be able to match the suspect to other potential entries or investigations. The most useful information is suspect name, rank and military affiliation; suspect hope number or social media profile; and date and location of the assault

Explaining the CATCH Program to Victims






- CATCH entries are only assessed by investigators from the Services' Military Criminal Investigation
 Organizations (MCIOs) that have been specially assigned to CATCH Headquarters.
 - CATCH HQ MCIOs assess entries against other entries and against DoD Law Enforcement databases to detect matches and potentially identify serial offenders.
 - SARCs, local law enforcement, and local MCIOs do not have access to CATCH data.
 - CATCH entries are not used to trigger a safety exception for Restricted Reports.
 - CATCH entry information about a suspect is not used by promotion boards or for any other administrative or disciplinary matters.
- No victim PII is collected in CATCH entries.
 - There is no victim identification information inside the CATCH system.
 - If there is a match, the SARC will locate the victim's contact information in the Defense Sexual Assault Incident Database (DSAID), which is a separate SAPR database and not connected to the CATCH system.
- Victims may update their original CATCH entry or opt out of the CATCH Program at any time.
- Victims will be notified of a potential match by a specially-trained CATCH HQ Notification POC.

Frequently Asked Questions





Do I have to provide my name?

No, you cannot share your name. The CATCH Program is anonymous. There is no victim identification information inside the CATCH system. If there is a match, the SARC will locate the victim's contact information in DSAID, which is a separate SAPR database and not connected to the CATCH system.

How long do you keep my entry in the CATCH system?

Each entry is kept for 10 years. This means that you could be contacted at any time over the next 10 years if there is a potential match, as long as you do not opt out and your contact information does not change. If you had a Sexual Assault Forensic Examination (SAFE) Kit, it will also be retained for 10 years.

I have more questions. Who can I speak with before deciding to submit an entry?

If you are eligible, your SARC or SAPR VA can offer you referral to a Special Victims' Counsel/Victims' Legal Counsel/Victims' Counsel, who is your personal attorney (not a prosecutor or defense attorney). They can help answer legal questions about the CATCH Program or general information about the military justice system.

Facilitating Restricted & Unrestricted Report CATCH Entries





For victims reporting a Restricted Report or certain Unrestricted Reports, the SARC will:

- Review DD Form 2910 and collect victim contact information on page 3 in the event that there is a match and the victim needs to be contacted.
- Generate a DSAID Control Number for the official report from the DD Form 2910. The SARC will
 use this DSAID Control Number to go into the CATCH system to generate a username and
 password.

Facilitating CATCH Entries When Victims Do Not Report





For victims not wanting to file an official report of sexual assault:

- SARCs need to collect victims' contact information, in case there is a match, in an official form that can be uploaded to DSAID for safekeeping.
- Victims will complete the DD Form 2910-4, "Catch a Serial Offender Program Explanation and Notification Form for SAPR-Related Inquiry (SRI) CATCH Entries" and provide contact information.
- The DD Form 2910-4 is not a report of sexual assault. It is a CATCH form for victims who do not file a report.
- SARCs will generate the corresponding DSAID Control Number for the SRI, which will be used by the SARC in the CATCH system to generate a CATCH username and password.




Sample CATCH Username and Password





Important Reminders:

- The username and password expire in 30 calendar days.
- Other timeframes are available in the Instruction Sheet for Victims Submitting CATCH Entries, available at www.sapr.mil/catch.
- SARCs will print out this username and password to avoid mistakes when copying.



Key CATCH Program Personnel





CATCH HQ MCIO Lead and Team

Each Military Service has specially-trained MCIO investigators assigned to a team to assess entries for matches with other entries. The CATCH MCIO HQ Lead is part of that team and assesses the potential matches.

CATCH HQ SAPR Lead (Service/NGB Admins)

Each Service and the National Guard Bureau (NGB) has specially trained SAPR program personnel who manage data and procedures related to CATCH. The CATCH HQ SAPR Leads also enroll SARCs in the CATCH system so they may generate usernames and passwords.

CATCH HQ Notification POC

Each Service and the NGB will assign notification responsibility to two CATCH HQ Notification POCs. The POCs shall be:

- Specially-trained SARCs, SAPR VAs, CATCH HQ SAPR Leads, or SAPR Program Manager
- Have a D-SAACP certification and be able to maintain MRE 514 confidentiality
- Have DSAID access

In addition, each Military Service Academy will have its own CATCH HQ Notification POC

Note: Some Services may wish to have the local SARC provide the notification, but the CATCH Notification POC will also be present to ensure the victim receives all the available information.



CATCH Training on JKO





- "CATCH a Serial Offender (CATCH) Program Introduction Training"
 - This 45-minute course is designed to provide DoD personnel with a basic overview and understanding of the CATCH Program. CATCH01 explains the eligibility requirements, that CATCH entries are anonymous, and that participation is in the CATCH is completely voluntary.
