### Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Policy

DoD SAPRO develops policy that is trauma-informed and recovery-oriented to advance prevention efforts, provide victim assistance, and guide SAPR personnel. The SAPR policy requires that every sexual assault is treated as an emergency, regardless of when it is reported. ### Key Policies

#### DoD Directive (DoDD) 6495.01, “Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program”

Establishes the SAPR program through high-level general policy. Detailed procedures are available in DoD Instruction (DoDI) 6495.02, Volume 1

#### DoDI 6495.02, Volume 1, “Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program Procedures”

Establishes comprehensive, detailed procedures for the response to sexual assault within the DoD, including requirements for victim advocacy, healthcare, training standards, and monthly case management groups

#### DoDI 6495.02, Volume 2, “Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program: Education and Training”

Establishes training requirements for Service members, individuals who supervise Service members, and DoD civilian personnel

#### DoDI 6495.02, Volume 3, “Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program: Retaliation Response for Adult Sexual Assault Cases”

Establishes policy, assigns responsibilities, and prescribes procedures focusing only on the response to retaliation related to adult sexual assault cases

#### DoDI 6495.03, “Defense Sexual Assault Advocate Certification Program (D-SAACP)”

Issues guidance and procedures to ensure all personnel providing advocacy services to victims of sexual assault hold professional credentials

#### Convalescent Leave Policy for Service Members

Located in DoDI 1327.06, “Leave and Liberty Policy and Procedures,” and special procedures for Convalescent Leave for Restricted Reports is found in DoDI 6495.02, Volume 1. Convalescent leave is not needed for Service member victims to attend scheduled medical or non-medical appointments, services, or counseling related to sexual assault incidents during normal duty status or during normal duty hours

#### Safe-to-Report Policy

Prescribes guidance and procedures for the treatment of alleged collateral misconduct by Service member victims of sexual assault. This policy is located in DoDI 6495.02, Volume 1

#### Catch a Serial Offender (CATCH) Program

Details the CATCH procedures that enable eligible personnel to anonymously submit suspect information to help the DoD identify serial offenders. Information about the program is available at [sapr.mil/catch](https://sapr.mil/catch)
