SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Annual Report on Sexual Assault in the Military

In response to your 27 July 2020 data call, I am forwarding the Department of Air Force (DAF) input to the FY2020 Department of Defense (DoD) Annual Report on Sexual Assault in the Military.

The DAF Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) program seeks to reduce sexual assault and increase victim reporting, thereby narrowing the gap between the prevalence rate and the number of incidences reported. FY2020 saw a 1% decrease in sexual assault reports from FY2019. Although FY2020 saw the second highest reporting number in the history of the DAF SAPR program, about two-thirds of estimated past-year sexual assaults of active duty Airmen and Guardians remain unreported. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the Department could not complete a prevalence report in 2020 as these require face-to-face survey interaction. However, the latest prevalence survey (2018 Workplace and Gender Relations Survey of Active Duty Members) showed sexual assault prevalence increased from previous survey iterations. The DAF believes the continued high level in victim reporting in FY2020 demonstrates increased comfort in coming forward, and reflects a positive effect of the SAPR program.

The DAF remains dedicated to combating sexual assault through a collaborative and comprehensive approach, teaming with multiple functional partners to strengthen prevention efforts and response capabilities. Ultimately, sexual violence is not tolerated, and we are committed to fostering a culture of dignity and respect for all members.

FY 2020 Annual Report on Sexual Assault in the Military Executive Summary: Department of the Air Force

The Air and Space Force remain committed to combating sexual assault and focused on reducing sexual assault prevalence while increasing efforts for high-quality victim care. A key element in successfully addressing sexual assault is to ensure every Airman, Guardian, and family member has the opportunity to live and work in a healthy environment where he or she is treated with dignity, respect, and compassion. To encourage victims to report sexual assault and harassment, the Department of the Air Force (DAF) has diligently worked to educate commanders on removing barriers to reporting and has provided enhanced protection from retaliation for victims and their peers after making a report.

The DAF's integrated prevention and response efforts continue to evolve as new initiatives are introduced. The "Sexual Communication and Consent Program," an innovative evidence-informed sexual assault prevention training, was piloted at Basic Military Training. Efforts to evaluate training also increased, including one to assess the effectiveness of bystander intervention training, and a second to incorporate evaluation methods into the curriculum development of annual SAPR training for Calendar Year (CY) 2021. The DAF also added 10 prevention personnel to its staff. Finally, the Headquarters Air Force (HAF) realigned the Resiliency operations and training branches in order to improve efficiency, focus, and access. The DAF continues to work the Prevention Plan of Action by establishing cross-functional efforts to build an integrated prevention framework.

Further, the DAF's efforts include implementing the Sexual Assault Accountability and Investigation Task Force (SAAITF) recommendations to include enhanced collaboration among legal offices, military criminal investigators, and circuit trial counsel (Special Victims Investigation and Prosecution Capability) for investigations of sexual assault, domestic violence, and child abuse, from investigation through the termination of trial proceedings, if applicable.

The Secretary of the Air Force established the Interpersonal Violence Task Force in July 2020 to examine whether the DAF is keeping our Airmen, Guardians, and civilians safe from interpersonal violence (IPV). The Task Force conducted a survey of DAF personnel that inquired about respondents' experiences with IPV in the past two years, collected administrative data from various helping agencies, and held focus groups with DAF personnel. The Task Force is currently analyzing respondent and focus group responses and drafting recommendations in order to improve DAF prevention capability.

The DAF continued to encourage reporting of sexual assaults in fiscal year 2020. The impact of the DAF's sexual assault prevention and response campaign is reflected in the reporting and estimated prevalence data trends. The number of restricted reports and unrestricted reports in fiscal year 2020 was 1661. Recent trends demonstrate that victims trust the DAF's processes enough to feel comfortable with reporting. Of these 1661 reports, 1095 were unrestricted and 566 remained restricted at the end of the fiscal year. Of the 1095 unrestricted reports, 146 reports were

previously restricted and converted to unrestricted. The DAF continued strenuous efforts to support victims and help propel their recovery. As such, commanders granted 207 of the 213 requests for expedited transfers in order to help victims recover in a supportive environment away from their offender. Additionally, victim referrals for additional supportive services in fiscal year 2020 increased for both unrestricted and restricted reports (by 25% and 16% for total referrals, respectively) despite the slightly lower number of total reports from fiscal year 2019. Mental Health and Victim Advocates referrals topped the list for both populations, while a large percentage of Unrestricted Reporting referrals were to the Special Victims Counsel.

In terms of investigation and disposition, the DAF propelled cases using established processes and policies. There were 508 subject investigations with disposition information to report in fiscal year 2020. Of those, 113 subjects were outside of the Department of Defense's legal and jurisdictional authority, and a civilian or foreign authority exercised jurisdiction over four service member subjects. Of the remaining 391 subjects with reportable FY20 disposition data, 278 were held accountable by Command. Command action was precluded with respect to 111 subjects because of victim non-participation or insufficient evidence of any offense. Cases completed court martial proceedings an average of 10 days faster than in fiscal year 2019, but cases continued to reach final disposition of non-judicial punishment after an average of 170 days, the same as in the prior fiscal year. In short, commanders found sufficient evidence to support sexual assault or other misconduct charges against 71% of subjects who were under the jurisdictional authority of the Department of Defense.

The Covid-19 operating environment has modified victim advocacy and training. The DAF worked throughout the year to provide virtual advocacy and training options to reach our Airmen and Guardians. While COVID-19 significantly impacted operations, victim assistance and advocacy remained largely uninterrupted. DAF presented the option for SAPR personnel to complete DD Form 2910s and subsequent forms via phone and receive the same via encrypted email. Field feedback indicated that while the flexibility to exercise this option was greatly appreciated, most offices were able to safely abide by the Center for Disease Control social distancing guidelines and meet clients in-person. SARCs indicated the option to provide virtual SAPR advocacy (to include filing reports) was incredibly useful, as many installation SARCs serve geographically separated units in other countries. COVID-19 caused many countries to restrict their borders, so virtual advocacy was critical to mission effectiveness.

As we look to the future, the DAF will continue its focus on providing a world-class response capability and will continue to collaborate with academia, industry, and sister-services taking a deeper look at prevention to accelerate our progress towards an Air and Space Force free from sexual assault. Despite many competing challenges, DAF leadership remains personally and wholeheartedly engaged in exploring new frontiers and breaking down barriers to solve this complex and sensitive issue. Today's Airmen and Guardians represent the best of America. They will embrace this challenge and their vision will shape the Air and Space Force's sexual assault and harassment prevention and response future.

1. Goal 1—Prevention: "institutionalize evidenced-based, informed prevention practice and policies across the Department so that all Military Service members are treated with dignity and respect, and have the knowledge, tools, and support needed to prevent sexual assaults."

DAF PPoA Phase II, Plan of Action and Milestones and Logic Model, was completed in Oct 2020. DAF began addressing milestones to complete short term objectives. Efforts to complete the short term objectives are on track with anticipated timely completion by May 2021. A1Z realignment is aimed for full implementation in spring of 2021. The realignment enhances DAF collaboration, increased headquarters-level prevention professionals, and established processes and procedures to lead and institutionalize a comprehensive approach to prevention (short term objectives 4.1.3, 4.2.2 and 4.7.1).

COVID-19 presented the Services with a variety of challenges requiring adaptability and flexibility.

To maximize social distancing and public safety, DAF adapted many prevention activities to be executed virtually. However, with the initial onset of restrictions happening in March 2020, many installations had to drastically reduce or cancel Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention month activities in April. As the changed operating environment endured, Major Commands (MAJCOMs) and installations partnered with their Public Affairs teams to leverage social media and other virtual marketing opportunities to continue prevention efforts. Many installation Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) teams also conducted outreach remotely by attending virtual Commander's Calls, professional military education, Newcomer's Briefs, etc.. When feasible and with social distance, some installations still conducted in-person prevention (e.g., drive-up info/swag fairs, dorm walk-abouts with other helping agencies, etc.).

Due to COVID-19 conditions, in April 2020 the DAF adjusted annual SAPR training to increase flexibility and adaptability for virtual and socially distant delivery. Ultimately, DAF efficiently and quickly incorporated training, education, and leadership into virtual strategies to meet the needs of the Total Force.

DAF is moving to a fully integrated prevention and resiliency strategy with an emphasis on collaboration among stakeholders across the Department and external partners at all levels. Because resourcing often affects implementation, DAF began a larger realignment, improving prevention staffing levels to increase subject matter expertise across the prevention portfolio. This realignment will improve organizational structure to fully incorporate a collaborative comprehensive prevention approach. This process includes addressing prevention funding and preparing for potential resourcing needs.

- 2. The DAF SAPR program continues all efforts under this goal as identified in the previous annual report and has undertaken several additional initiatives to strengthen delivery of consistent and effective advocacy for all military Service members.

The aforementioned realignment in Headquarters Air Force (HAF) staff separated the SAPR Operations and Training functions from HAF/A1Z and relocated them to the Air Force Personnel Center (AFPC) in San Antonio, TX. This move created the DPFZ Branch within AFPC, which allowed the A1Z structure to mirror the remainder of the A1 (Manpower, Personnel, and Services) organization. The establishment of DPFZ enhanced cross-functional collaboration across the A1 portfolio for the development and oversight of program execution guidance for all prevention and resiliency functions. The increased resourcing and manpower associated with the DPFZ stand-up will allow for experts within multiple forms of violence prevention (to include suicide, intimate partner violence, workplace violence, and child maltreatment) to work alongside the SAPR personnel in creating a more integrated approach to violence prevention for DAF. Additionally, the move co-located the oversight for worldwide SARC manning with the Air Force's personnel and readiness experts, enabling smooth execution and management of all SAPR positions.

When the Defense Counterintelligence and Security Agency advised that they were again accepting targeted populations for inclusions in Continuous Evaluation (CE) screening DAF undertook strenuous efforts to enroll all new and incumbent personnel assigned to SAPR in CE. Efforts included routine messaging to MAJCOMs to clarify expectations for the process and minimize confusion. Timely CE enrollment required seamless collaboration between SAPR and Information Protection personnel at and below the headquarters-level. Initial enrollment began with full-time SAPR personnel and upon completion, extended to Volunteer Victim Advocates (VVA) who had the appropriate security clearances. VVA enrollment completion varied amongst MAJCOMs due to Information Protection and Security Manager manning constraints. For all SAPR assets not yet enrolled in CE, A1Z strictly enforces the interim background check requirements to ensure only verified individuals are working with victims of sexual assault.

Despite the unique challenges of 2020, the MAJCOM SAPR Program Managers conducted refresher training for all our SARCs and SAPR VAs. This year's training included modules by Difference Makers and 10 Strong, who acknowledge male victims through various social spheres. These presentations discussed how toxic masculinity plays a significant role in violence and how

boys' socialization in patriarchal societies often normalizes violence and prevents most males from expressing emotions or feelings. SARCs and SAPR VAs learned that unhealthy masculinity not only makes males vulnerable to victimization but normalizes societal behaviors that can lead to the victimization of others. The training also included a male victimization survivor panel, highlighting both the commonalities and differences in survivor response to assault. The MAJCOM SAPR Program Managers also offered training from the Wounded Warrior Project and Intimate Partner Violence Program Coordinator. These trainings discussed available victim services, eligibility, and program goals so SARCs and SAPR VAs better understood how these programs can assist survivors.

DAF SAPR personnel at all levels continued collaboration with civilian agencies. Agencies of special interest included colleges and universities, crisis and counseling centers, advocacy groups, and other resources dedicated to enhancing victim care, support, and recovery. The goal for this collaboration was to maximize effective engagement in order to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of services provided to victims and survivors of sexual assault. DAF's open dialogue with both internal and external agencies allows for program improvement through expert consultation and awareness of other frameworks that could be incorporated in order to help DAF achieve its goals of reducing the prevalence of sexual assault and closing the gap between prevalence and reporting.

In FY20, DAF converted the military SARC positions to special duty assignments, which changed the Air Force Specialty Code from falling under the Force Support (38F) career field to its own identifier (88C). This allowed the Department to recruit from a wider pool of officers to serve as SARCs, and at the end of FY20, approximately one-third of the military SARCs were officers from outside of the 38F career field. Finally, AF/A1Z re-opened the opportunity for civilian SARCs to volunteer for deployments. This enabled civilian SARCs an added opportunity for professional development, reduced the deployments levied upon military members, and afforded down range SAPR programs to have the depth of experience of a civilian SARC.

While COVID-19 significantly impacted Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month and other prevention activities, victim assistance and advocacy remained largely uninterrupted. DAF presented the option for SAPR personnel to complete DD Form 2910s and subsequent forms via phone and receive via encrypted email. Field feedback indicated that the flexibility to exercise this opton was greatly appreciated, but most offices were able to safely abide by the Center for Disease Control social distancing guidelines and meet clients in-person. DAF's United States Air Forces in Europe-Air Forces Africa (USAFE-AFAFRICA) indicated that the option to provide virtual SAPR advocacy (to include filing reports) was incredibly useful, as many installation SARCs serve geographically separated units in other countries. With the COVID-19 situation, many countries restricted their borders, so virtual advocacy was crucial. USAFE-AFAFRICA did experience challenges with traveling to victims (and having victims travel to larger installations for additional

care), as further limitations were enforced, command approvals were needed for travel. For restricted reports, this presented challenges, and USAFE-AFAFRICA found it easier for supporting agencies to travel to victims, when feasible.

DAF did not experience any situations where a Sexual Assault Medical Forensic Examiner needed to assist a victim with a DD-2910. Most MAJCOMs did not report challenges with telephonic advocacy while victims were awaiting healthcare, and many reported they were able to accompany victims for SAFEs. Finally, USAFE-AFAFRICA did experience challenges with telehealth services (particularly with mental health). Services with on-base providers began in a limited capacity, and many installations did not have accessible English-speaking options off-base available or accepting new clients.

Much like prevention efforts, DAF SARCs maintained a strong virtual presence to advertise services. SARCs across the enterprise leveraged basewide emails, virtual courses and Commander's Calls, and social media platforms like Facebook to engage and advertise services and availability.

Throughout FY20, DAF remained engaged in thorough oversight of the SAPR program. This included program-wide audits by the Air Force Audit Agency (AFAA), as well as local audits conducted by MAJCOM staff and/or installation inspectors. DAF actively managed three AFAA assessments that reviewed First Responder Training, Program Management in-garrison, and Program Management in the Air Forces Central (AFCENT) area of responsibility. For the SAPR First Responder Training audit, AFAA conducted a review of the training completion and population trained to ensure that DAF remained compliant with by-law, DoDI, and AFI requirements. In response to this audit, DAF/A1Z created a self-assessment line item providing commanders with easy visibility for their installation's training compliance. DAF/A1Z and the field fully addressed all remaining training shortfalls identified in this audit. Moreover, DAF/A1Z addressed deficiencies cited in the Program Management audit of in-garrison SAPR programs by instituting a guarterly review of program elements (with special emphasis on CMG completion). This review is accomplished via a quarterly DSAID pull and MAJCOM SAPR PMs submitting a tracker each quarter for items not tracked in DSAID. The quarterly tracker ensures that MAJCOM SAPR PMs maintain continuous oversight of their installations and quickly address any identified deficiencies. Finally, the deficiencies cited in the AFCENT Program Management audit resulted from outdated requirements at the Air Force level. DAF/A1Z addressed these in the updates to Air Force Instruction 90-6001, Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program, published in July 2020.

While COVID-19 limited DAF's capability to conduct in-person staff assisted visits and inspections, many MAJCOMs conducted these virtually. Additionally, some bases within close proximity still reported conducting in-person staff assisted visits. Many installations also amended Case Management Group meetings to be conducted virtually. Installation practices varied based on local health protection conditions (HPCON) and leadership guidance. Regardless, MAJCOMs reported minimal significant findings from inspections and visits to DAF headquarters.

During this period the AF SAPR Program had 8 suspensions and 11 revocations as follows:

- Suspensions 3 SARCs; 5 Active Duty (AD) military Volunteer Victim Advocates (VVAs)
- Revocations 5 SARCs (1 Civ SARC, 3 AD Deputy SARCs, 1 Guard SARC); 6 VAs (1 SAPR VA Civ, 3 AD mil VVAs, 2 Guard)

There were no reinstatements.

According to the Office of the Air Force Surgeon General, no adult Service members experienced a hindrance in medical care due to a lack of SAFE kits or timely access to appropriate laboratory testing resources or other resources.

The Air Force issued 112 Military Protective Orders (MPOs) as a result of Unrestricted Reports of sexual assaults in fiscal year 2020 and 2 were violated by the alleged offender. The issuing commander provide the victims and the alleged offenders with copies of the DD Form 2873, Military Protective Order as required.

2.7 <u>Future Plans:</u> Describe your leadership-approved future plans (if any) to further improve the achievement of the Victim Assistance and Advocacy goal.

While the opening of the military SARC positions beyond the 38F career field allowed DAF/A1Z to advertise to a wider pool of candidates, it also meant that in order to be successful in attracting top quality candidates, DAF/A1Z would need to adopt marketing strategies. In order to do so, the Operations Branch decided they would need a cross-functional working group to brainstorm effective solutions. The idea to establish a working group was approved in September 2020, and the working group began meeting at the beginning of FY21. The working group stood up with the goal of filling military SARC vacancies with the top qualified candidates.

The Departments of Defense and Air Force determined collateral misconduct by a sexual assault victim is one of the most significant barriers to reporting assault because of fear of punishment. In response, and to encourage sexual assault reporting, the United States Air Force Academy (USAFA) implemented a Safe to Report policy in 2018. The USAFA policy offers certain protections to sexual assault victims who commit collateral misconduct related to a sexual assault incident. It seeks to encourage victims to report who might not otherwise do so because of a fear of disciplinary action. The USAFA policy prohibits commanders from disciplining sexual assault

victims for violating certain designated offenses unless aggravating circumstances warrant discipline. The designated offenses are: alcohol use or possession (e.g. underage drinking, possession of alcohol in dorms); consensual intimate behavior in the cadet area; unprofessional relationships/fraternization among cadets; or cadet-area limits restrictions. The USAFA policy ensures collateral misconduct is handled in a uniform way and encourages reporting. In FY21, the Secretary of Defense will be prescribing a version of a safe-to-report policy which will be applicable across the Department of Defense and include a mechanism for tracking collateral misconduct.

3. Goal 3—Investigation: "sustain a high level of competence in the investigation of adult sexual assault using investigative resources to yield timely results."

3.1 <u>Strategic Summary:</u> Summarize your efforts for achieving the Investigation goal. In this strategic summary, include significant updates and/or force-wide changes and/or initiatives begun or completed by your Military Service in FY 2020. In FY20, AFOSI staffed 22 specialized sexual assault investigators (SAPR agents) to oversee their unit's support and compliance with Special Victims' Investigation and Prosecution (SVIP) capability requirements. AFOSI strategically located SAPR agents across the globe to maximize capabilities at locations historically shown to have higher occurrences of alleged sexual assaults. AFOSI also sourced and initiated additional specialized crime scene and forensic trainings for SAPR agents to increase expertise on sex-related offenses and to allow agents to lead a larger geographic area of responsibility. While the SAPR designated agents are highly specialized in sex-related offenses, AFOSI continued standard practice to train all agents to conduct sexual offense investivations. Agents receive their initial training on sexual crimes at Basic Special Investigator's Course (BSIC) and receive more advanced training at AFOSI's Sexual Crimes Investigations Training Program (SCITP). SCTIP exemplifies an ongoing partnership between MCIO, JA, and SAPR in the efforts to combat sexual crimes. The course priority for SCTIP attendance is given to SAPR agents and Joint Sexual Assault Team investigators. While 115 AFOSI agents, Judge Advocates, and Security Forces members attended SCTIP in FY19, only 59 students completed the course in FY20 due to AFOSI having to cancel all but two iterations of the course in response to COVID-19 restrictions.

Since CATCH launched in 2019, 348 DAF victims have chosen to participate in the database, and AFOSI expects this number to continuing rising as more of the population learns of the program. AFOSI completely revised their Criminal Investigations instruction and developed Current Operating Procedures to streamline the process for agents investigating violent crimes, including sexual assaults. These changes included an explanation of the CATCH program and the entire

process associated with the program: from victim reporting to Headquarters actions-through the Sexual Assault Response Coordinator notification-and victim interview/case initiation.

3.2 <u>COVID-19 Impact</u>: Describe any investigation-related challenges (if any) your Military Service may have encountered due to the COVID-19 pandemic (e.g., personnel training and delays or inability to conduct sexual assault victim and witness interviews) and how such challenges were addressed.

Training and conference attendance for AFOSI took a direct impact as a result of COVID-19. Many training programs are governed by Federal Law Enforfocement Training Center (to include BSIC and SCTIP). In response to the pandemic, AFOSI paused all advance courses until further notice which not only included SCTIP but also the specialized training programs for SAPR agents. SCTIP held two iterations prior to COVID measures taking effect, and 59 students successfully completed the program. Additionally, AFOSI was unable to have agents attend the advanced Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) training and various criminal investigative conferences. ICAC training has been paused until the Officer of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Program is able to align funding with relief from COVID-19 restrictions. This pause in ICAC training does not impact AFOSI's ability to investigate child sex crimes.

Despite the current hiatus on SAPR agent specialized training and SCITP, AFOSI embarked on sourcing credible alternatives. AFOSI identified credible training center alternatives for the SAPR agent specialized training. These alternatives are being vetted for applicability. Finally, AFOSI has been developing an appropriate SCITP training program to bring this tool back online.

3.3 Evidence Processing Challenges: Describe any evidence processing challenges at the Defense Forensic Science Center (e.g., shipping delays and turnaround time for processing of SAFE kits and other evidence) and actions taken to address or mitigate these challenges. Diagnostic lab technicians, staff, and AFOSI agents have been engaged from the onset of COVID-19 restrictions to understand the potential short and long-term effects from shipping or other delays. There was not a dramatic increase in processing time for processing evidence related to SAFE kits.

3.4 <u>Future Plans:</u> Describe your leadership-approved future plans (if any) to further improve the achievement of the Investigation goal.

AFOSI is developing courses of action to combat COVID-19 restrictions levied on advanced training in order to continue uninterrupted capabilities to provide sexual assault victims with a fast and thorough investigation. This will be achieved by sourcing alternate training deemed equal or better to that previously offered. AFOSI will also attend relevant conferences to learn about new techniques, new types of equipment, revealing unpublished data, and having crucial conversations with proven experts in criminal investigations.

AFOSI is submitting a request in the 23 POM for critical programmed investments in sexual assault and other violent crime investigations for the Department of the Air Force (DAF) Office of Special Investigations (OSI), based upon national and DoD requirements and dramatic increases of caseload and evidentiary demands to OSI. As the DAF's only felony investigations and counterintelligence agency, OSI is solely authorized and charged with investigating sexual

violence and the majority of aggravated assault incidents in the U.S Air Force and U.S Space Force (USAF and USSF).

- 4. Goal 4—Accountability: "maintain a high competence in holding alleged offenders appropriately accountable."
- 4.1 <u>Strategic Summary:</u> Summarize your efforts to achieve the Accountability goal. In this strategic summary, include significant updates and/or force-wide changes begun or completed by your Military Service in FY 2020. DAF is currently in the process of rewriting its military justice policies, including promulgation of a new policy which specifically addresses minimum requirements (including training) for members of the Special Victims Investigation and Prosecution (SVIP) capability, as well as minimum training requirements for Special Victims' Counsel and Victim and Witness Assistance Program (VWAP) personnel.

In FY20, DAF continued to provide SVIP training in a variety of courses to judge advocates and paralegals. The courses detailed SVIP responsibilities for each military justice practitioner category. The following courses covered relevant SVIP responsibilities: Judge Advocate Staff Officer Course, Paralegal Craftsman Course, Military Justice Administration Course (MJAC), Intermediate and Advanced Sexual Assault Litigations Courses, Trial and Defense Advocacy Course, Advanced Trial Advocacy Course, VWAP Symposium, and Staff Judge Advocate Course. Further, judge advocates, paralegals, VWAP personnel, and legal assistance attorneys completed self-guided, annual SAPR First Responder training; attorneys with military justice responsibilities completed additional training focused specifically on the investigation and prosecution of sexual assault cases.

DAF ensured military legal and law enforcement capabilities are integrated at the earliest opportunity in every sexual assault investigation, ensuring offenders are held appropriately accountable for their misconduct. The Circuit Trial Counsel (CTC) program continued to set the standard for Special Victim's prosecution in the DAF. To ensure CTC integration at the earliest stages of a case investigation, all base legal offices have been assigned a Special Victim's Unit CTC to serve on the SVIP team. The SVIP team is activated within 72-hours of notification to the legal office of an SVIP eligible investigation. This has allowed base-level judge advocates and investigators to have a designated, invested, and continuous individual point of contact throughout the investigation. Additionally, it has allowed for optimal CTC experience and knowledge in the earliest stages of a case.

4.2 <u>COVID-19 Impact</u>: Describe any accountability-related challenges (if any) your Military Service may have encountered due to the COVID-19 pandemic (e.g., personnel training; delayed client meetings with sexual assault victims; trial delays; and witness preparation delays) and how such challenges were addressed.

The Secretary of Defense Memorandum, "Travel Restrictions for DoD Components in Response to Coronavirus Disease 2019" dated 11 March 2020, prevented Circuit Trial Counsels (CTCs), victims, and witnesses, from traveling to participate in courts-martial for a period from 11 March 2020 until 22 May 2020. Courts-martial scheduled during this period were delayed to later dates. Subsequently, courts-martial commenced through the issuance of mission essential memorandums by the convening authority for each respective court-martial, as well as exception to policy memorandums being completed for CTCs to allow for travel and restriction of movement measures (ROM) being observed where local guidance requires. For cases involving travel of participants from the United States to overseas locations, military rotators have been used to transport trial participants instead of commercial air to facilitate travel of US residents to otherwise prohibited locations and reduce ROM requirements. ROM requirements continue to limit the ability of CTCs in the United States to travel out of the United States.

As it relates to sexual assault training, COVID-19 did not impact the Judge Advocate Staff Officer Course, the Paralegal Craftsman Course, and the Staff Judge Advocate Course (see Goal 4.1). However, pandemic travel restrictions limited and continues to limit training opportunities such as the advocacy and litigation courses listed in Goal 4.1.

While in-person training is a key component of many courses, such as the Military Justice Administration Course (MJAC), advocacy/litigation courses, and the VWAP Symposium, efforts to remedy the gap have proven successful. MJAC utilized recorded lessons to bridge the training gap for MJAC. The Government Trial and Appellate Counsel Division is participating in virtual training opportunities, to include virtual Circuit Advocacy Training. The VWAP Symposium, which serves as the primary training for VWAP coordinators and liaisons, was also cancelled this year due to COVID-19. To ensure VWAP personnel receive a minimum level of training necessary to run a successful program, DAF developed a one-day live-webinar titled, "VWAP Snapshot: Building a Solid Foundation." This interim training is an 8-hour virtual training course that provides important information for building and maintaining a successful Victim and Witness Assistance Program. This training is not intended to replace the in-residence symposium, but instead, it serves as an initial or refresher course for VWAP personnel.

Prior to being certified as a Special Victims' Counsel (SVC), a judge advocate must attend an inresidence SVC Course. The Air Force Judge Advocate General's School (AFJAGS) was unable to host the in-residence AF SVC course scheduled for May 2020 at Maxwell AFB, AL due to travel restrictions imposed due to COVID-19. Instead, in April 2020 AFJAGS, in conjunction with the SVC Division, began to transition this course to an online virtual offering. The DoD General Counsel determined that the AF virtual SVC Course sufficiently satisfied the in-residence training requirements for SVC certification. In FY20, 101 joint service attorneys and paralegals completed the on-line SVC Course: 46 AF (26 JAGs/20 paralegals), 22 Army, 10 Navy, 14 Marines, 7 Coast Guard, and 2 National Guard Bureau.

4.3 Effectiveness of the Special Victims' Counsel (SVC)/Victims' Legal Counsel (VLC)
Program: Describe any enhancements your Military Service has made to the SVC/VLC
program; how case load management is being accomplished for sexual assault and
domestic violence victims; and the feedback mechanism(s) and metrics used to determine

In FY20, the Air Force SVC Division continued to meet the Department's metrics for measuring success. The first metric evaluated the selection process for SVCs. The Office of Professional Development (AF/JAX) coordinated all SVC candidates with the Special Victims' Counsel Division Chief to ensure each candidate met the expectations of the SVC leadership. The Judge Advocate General (TJAG) then selected candidates who advanced beyond the above vetting process. To facilitate the decision making, TJAG reviewed each candidate's complete duty history, to include Officer Performance Reports, awards and decorations, assignment history, and any instances or allegations of misconduct.

The second metric ensured that incoming personnel are certified to be SVCs and Special Victims' Paralegals (SVPs). AFJAGS continues to facilitate a certification course for both adult and child clients annually. This fiscal year, 45 incoming AF SVCs and SVPs attended the virtual course in May 2020 course. The third and fourth metrics evaluated the service's ability to maximize face-toface interaction between the SVCs and their clients. At the end of FY20, the SVC Division had 48 operating locations world-wide housing 5 Chief Circuit Victims' Counsel; 3 Circuit Paralegal Managers; 46 Special Victims' Counsel; 44 Special Victims' Paralegals; and a headquarters office at Joint Base Andrews comprised of a Division Chief, Deputy Chief, Chief Appellate and Outreach, Chief Training and Programs, and SVC Paralegal Division Manager. The SVC Division also continued to assign responsibilities to individual SVC offices to provide services at operating locations with no SVCs assigned. DAF strategically selected these locations to facilitate the SVCs' and SVPs' ability to provide seamless coverage for victims assigned to locations with no local SVC office. The SVC Division equipped SVCs and SVPs with laptop computers, monitors, wireless connection devices, telephone headsets, and cell phones (iPhones) in order to facilitate regular and frequent communication between counsel and client. The Judge Advocate General's Corps Legal Information Services Directorate (AF/JAS) facilitated communication and interactions for SVCs through acquisition, installation, and management of Video Teleconference (VTC) equipment. Each SVC office has VTC equipment installed. The victim can use the VTC at the local legal office or another SVC Office to interact with the detailed SVC at his or her office if they are not co-located. VTC capability also ensures effective communication with headquarters, base legal offices, OSI, and other stakeholders. Given the travel restrictions related to COVID-19, the SVC Division also utilizes government provided platforms to include Microsoft Teams and Zoom to communicate with clients.

As a final metric, the SVC Division continued to rely upon the Victim Impact Survey administered by the Air Force Judge Advocate General's Corps Military Justice and Policy Division as the best measure of success for SVC services. SVC client feedback continued to be exceptionally positive in FY20. An impressive 99% of clients surveyed indicated they were "extremely satisfied" or "satisfied" with their SVC's representation and would recommend seeking SVC representation to another victim of sexual assault. FY20 survey responses indicate 98% (77/79) of respondents were "extremely satisfied" or "satisfied" with the way their SVC treated them. Additionally, an

impressive 97% (76/78) would recommend seeking SVC representation to another victim of sexual assault.

SVCs continued advising and assisting clients with their retaliation complaints, in addition to any complaints associated with ostracism and maltreatment. This has been a long-standing practice for the SVC Division, and clients are regularly advised of this area of representation in the Scope of Representation memorandum presented at the establishment of an attorney client relationship. Additionally, SVCs continue to receive training on retaliation complaints at the annual SVC Course each May.

Finally, DAF monitored and managed caseloads for individual SVCs through a number of interworking assessments. First, the SVC Division tracked clients and their assigned SVC through the Case Administration Tool, an electronic database managing client information. Second, each of the five circuits reported the number of clients and cases assigned to each SVC as well as the status of the case on a bi-weekly basis. Finally, the headquarters division actively monitored SVCs with higher caseloads to ensure adequate representation and services to all. Please note in FY20 domestic violence victims were not eligible for SVC representation, and requests for representation were considered on a case-by-case basis as an exception to statutory eligibility requirements. Requests for exceptions, and the number of grants and denials, were tracked by SVC Division Headquarters in combination with tracking total caseloads for each SVC. Domestic violence victims became eligible for SVC representation 1 December 2020. As noted above, the SVC Division tracked client numbers using various methods. First, the SVC Division tracked SVC caseloads through the Case Administration Tool, an electronic database managing client information. Second, each of the five regional circuits reported the number of clients and cases assigned to each SVC as well as the status of the case on a bi-weekly basis. Finally, the headquarters division actively monitored SVCs with higher caseloads to ensure adequate representation and services to all.

4.4 <u>Victim Notification</u>: How is your Military Service ensuring that the victim of an alleged sexual assault by another member of the Armed Forces is receiving notification of each significant event in the military justice process that relates to the investigation, prosecution, and confinement of the alleged perpetrator? (NDAA for FY 2020, section 538)

DAF codified this requirement in Air Force Instruction 51-201, *Administration of Military Justice*, which mandates that victims of an alleged sexual assault committed by another member of the Armed Forces receive written notification monthly on significant events for the case in the military justice process. The following constitute events warranting written notification: conclusion of the investigation; pre-trial confinement proceedings; preferral of charges; initial disposition decision; Article 32 preliminary hearing; referral of charges; all court proceedings (including arraignment, motions hearings, and trial dates); withdrawal of charges; dismissal of charges; post-trial hearings; vacation hearings; clemency submissions; appellate filings; appellate hearings; and appellate decisions.

Further, at all case proceedings, military judges have required the trial counsel to confirm on the record that any named victims in the case have received reasonable, accurate, and timely notice of the hearing and their right to be present in compliance with their rights under Article 6b, Uniform Code of Military Justice, and Rule for Courts-Martial 806. The Government Trial and Appellate Counsel Division created a DAF-specific trial procedure guide template that includes language wherein trial counsel positively confirms that the victim has been notified of the hearing. This tool

provided an additional mechanism to ensure base legal offices recognize and fulfill victim notification requirements for all proceedings in the case.

4.5 <u>Victim/Witness Assistance Program (VWAP)</u>: Has there been an increase in VWAP personnel? If so, how are the additional personnel being utilized? (NDAA for FY 2020, section 540)

The number of VWAP personnel within the DAF remained unchanged for FY20; however, additional VWAP personnel may be necessary in future years to accomplish DAF's implementation of Section 548 of the FY2020 NDAA, Legal Counsel for Victims of Alleged Domestic Violence (DV) Offenses. The DAF's DV victim representation plan will employ a multidisciplinary approach to provide legal counsel to victims of domestic violence offenses. VWAP personnel will triage DV victims and, based on the needs of the client, VWAP personnel will provide critical intake and can refer a victim to a legal assistance attorney or to an SVC in appropriate circumstances. This plan was fully implemented on 1 December 2020, and DAF continues to assess the number of additional VWAP personnel required to meet the needs of the program. During FY20, there were no reported instances of any VWAP positon undergoing significant changes to the scope of assigned duties. Within DAF, the installation commander delegates to the installation staff judge advocate (SJA) the official duties and responsibilities involved in overseeing the VWAP. The SJA selects a member of the legal office as the VWAP coordinator to implement and manage VWAP. Depending on the size of the military justice program at the installation, the SJA may assign personnel within the legal office to serve as victim liaisons as part of their routine duties. The victim liaison may be a judge advocate, paralegal, or other appropriate personnel within the legal office. The victim liaison is assigned to support victims during investigations/cases and is responsible for connecting victims with helping agencies and arranging for services, when appropriate. This system allows legal offices to properly scope their VWAP services according to the need.

VWAP coordinators and victim liaisons receive training at semi-annual VWAP symposiums. A VWAP symposium provides specialized training to ensure VWAP coordinators and victim liaisons are equipped with the tools necessary to run an effective program and provide exceptional victim services. Currently there is no appellate VWAP capability within DAF; however, DAF/JAJI is currently developing appellate VWAP protocol and policy requirements with an anticipated completion date of Summer 2021.

4.6 <u>CATCH Program</u>: Provide an update on your Military Service's implementation of the CATCH Program to include any challenges faced by victims and SARCs. Also, describe your efforts to promote awareness of the program. (SecDef Memorandum, "Actions to Address and Prevent Sexual Assault in the Military," (May 1, 2019), p. 2)

DAF continued to advertise and utilize the CATCH Program in FY20. DAF promoted the CATCH program at all levels, to include headquarters providing updates and discussions on CATCH at monthly MAJCOM teleconferences. MAJCOMs in-turn briefed this to their installation teams. DAF SAPR personnel at all levels continued to rely upon and utilize the materials available on through the CATCH website and DOD SAPRO's website to promote awareness. Additionally, SARCs briefed all victims of restricted reports of the opportunity to participate in CATCH as instructed on the DD2910.

DAF did not experience any major challenges with the CATCH Program in FY20. The majority of challenges experienced were administrative (predominantly account reactivation and maintenance). However, the system updates in February 2020, which provided users of a

reminder email when account inactivation approached, saved headquarters SAPR staff at least 1-2 hours per week previously dedicated to reactivating accounts.

4.7 <u>Future Plans</u>: Describe your leadership-approved future plans (if any) to further improve the achievement of the Accountability goal.

The Judge Advocate General has requested that an SVIP compliance review be completed by the end of 2020. The Government Trial and Appellate Division is spearheading the review for the DAF, which will identify issues with SVIP compliance and make recommendations and suggest changes to increase SVIP compliance in the future.

DAF created a multidisciplinary training team and coordinated with sister Services to develop uniform training programs for trial counsel, defense counsel, and special victims' counsel. The uniformed training developed by this team will ensure a baseline level of competency for all personnel involved in the prosecution of sexual assault cases across the Department of Defense. Implementation of these uniform training standards is anticipated to begin during calendar year 2021.

The Office of Professional Development will continue to develop and enhance the DAF's current population of senior litigation attorneys and continue tracking military justice experience through the use of the "Military Justice Experience Tracker" to aid The Judge Advocate General in assigning only the best qualified judge advocates to litigation positions.

5. Goal 5—Assessment: "effectively measure, analyze, assess, and report SAPR Program progress to improve effectiveness."

5.1 Strategic Summary: Summarize your efforts for achieving the Assessment goal. In this strategic summary, include significant updates and/or force-wide changes begun or completed by your Military Service in FY 2020. As applicable, include significant updates on efforts to fulfill your oversight responsibilities, to include the use of internal inspection programs; initiatives to ensure the quality, reliability, validity, and secure retention of data collected in the Defense Sexual Assault Incident Database (DSAID); and SARC and SAPR VA training. DAF completed the feasibility and acceptability study for incorporating the "Sexual Communication and Consent Program" training at Basic Military Training (BMT). The tailored training integrates tablet-based content into standard classroom training where trainees receive content based on their responses to an anonymous screening measure taken on the tablet. The feasibility study results demonstrated that trainees enjoyed using the tablets and found content both engaging and appropriate. Based on this initial phase, attitude changes toward prevention and victimization appear promising among trainees. Additionally, the study found increases in knowledge of sexual assault and consent across all programs, increases in confidence in trainees' abilities to resist unwanted sexual advances, and decreases dating and social risk behaviors.

In FY20, DAF maintained emphasis on program compliance and oversight. The headquarters staff created new tracking mechanisms to ensure more challenging compliance items received required attention. DAF engaged with MAJCOMs in a quarterly review of these trackers and leveraged the use of DSAID metrics to maintain accountability for key program elements.

Finally, despite challenges presented by COVID-19, DAF continually evaluated training content and efficiency. Each SARC and SAPR VA course included a pre- and post-test knowledge assessment and offered students the opportunity to provide feedback on individual blocks (as well as the entire course). The pre- and post-test served as initial measures to ensure SAPR personnel possessed the basic requisites to enter their positions, and this coupled with CEUs and strict D-SAACP oversight ensured that DAF retained only the highest caliber SARCs and SAPR VAs. In addition to continuous evaluation of the full-time SAPR personnel course content, DAF evaluated the Volunteer Victim Advocate Course in April 2020. This comprehensive review included feedback collected from students and facilitators, as well as inputs from SMEs to ensure the most up to date and relevant content. The curriculum is currently being updated with a scheduled release in Spring 2021.

5.2 <u>COVID-19 Impact</u>: Describe any assessment-related challenges (if any) your Military Service may have encountered due to the COVID-19 pandemic (e.g., personnel training and entry of reports into DSAID) and how such challenges were addressed.

Of the hurdles COVID-19 created for the SAPR program, one of the most significant was training. DAF has long recognized the value of in-person training for SAPR personnel, so the Department set expectations high for the quality of any virtual offerings. While DAF canceled the April SARC and SAPR VA course, which later created challenges for military SARCs, Air University and DAF/A1Z successfully adapted the July and October courses to a virtual delivery method. Similarly, MAJCOMs and installations followed suit and offered SAPR personnel refresher training and initial VVA training virtually. Some installations were still able to hold in-person initial VVA training while abiding by CDC social distancing requirements. While DAF received feedback that virtual training was largely successful, some MAJCOMs and installations reported that virtual classes were much more one-sided than the collaborative environment an in-person classroom provides.

COVID-19 movement restrictions for both military and civilian members as well as the lack of an April SARC course presented challenges for the enterprise-wide manning. Staffing the AFCENT area of responsibility (AOR) proved especially difficult, and DAF had to deploy minimally experienced military Deputy SARCs to fill Lead SARC positions within AFCENT. DAF successfully filled the AFCENT requirements, but there was minimal to no additional deployable manning to support should there have been any early returns or reclamas. Fortunately, DAF completed the FY20 requirements without any major issues, and AFCENT feedback on deployed SARCs remained largely poisitive. The Air University SARC Course has since restarted, and DAF is prioritizing military SARCs to attend in order to ensure no future concerns with staffing the AFCENT AOR.

5.3 <u>Future Plans:</u> Describe your leadership-approved future plans (if any) to further improve the achievement of the Assessment goal.

DAF's VVA course is currently being updated (expected publication in Spring 2021). The new course will include a feedback survey to gather data for continuous improvements for the curriculum. Additionally, DAF updated the 2021 Annual Total Force SAPR training; updates include breaking training out into tiers (emerging leaders and senior leaders) and including an assessment of learning objectives for all attendees.

Similarly, DAF continues efforts for the BMT tailored tablet-based training. Following the results of the pilot, DAF is developing plans for implementing this training full-time and continuously assessing the training to ensure all BMT trainees receive appropriate content.

DAF incorporated the requirements from the OUSD-PR memo dated 13 November 2019 into the updated version of AFI 90-6001, *Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program*, published on 15 July 2020. The AFI included all requirements from the memorandum and prescribed that the CMGs would track the days between an Expedited Transfer request and physical departure. AF/A1Z Operations worked with the MAJCOMs to provide execution guidance and oversight on the new CMG requirements.

6.2 Revised Expedited Transfer Procedures: How is your Military Service ensuring that upon approval of an expedited transfer the losing SARC is facilitating the scheduling of an "intake meeting" with the gaining SARC? What steps has your Military Service taken to ensure the gaining SARC meets with 100% of incoming expedited transfer victims? The SAPR policy regarding expedited transfers was expanded to allow the transfer of a Service member whose adult military dependent makes an allegation of sexual assault that was not domestic abuse-related. How many of these types of expedited transfers were granted? How many were denied? Of those requests that were granted, was the Service member transferred at the same time as the adult dependent, and if not, please describe the circumstances (e.g., a Service member was deployed or in specialized training and was transferred upon his/her return to the installation). Overall, how did the COVID-19 pandemic impact the expedited transfer process, and how did your Military Service adjust its processes to accommodate these transfer requests? (OUSD-PR Memorandum, "Revisions to the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program's Expedited Transfer Policy," (February 10, 2020), p. 3-5)

DAF has created a process for ensuring that upon approval of expedited transfers the losing and gaining SARC will collaborate to schedule an intake meeting, IAW policy and directives. When expedited transfers are annotated in DSAID, SARCs are required to submit a bi-weekly and quarterly tracker highlighting a number of indicators, regarding the transfer, to include if SARC to SARC notifications were completed. These are currently collected at the MAJCOM level, reviewed, and forwarded to AF/A1Z. This type of monitoring ensures the ability to swiftly address any challenges associated with this requirement. During this period, 21 adult military dependents made allegations of sexual assault (that were not domestic violence related and were eligible for expedited transfers). At the time of this report, 4 of them requested a transfer. One was denied because a credible report of sexual assault could not be determined. Of note the alleged subject in this case was discharged via other findings/misconduct unrelated to the case. The other 3 reports

were approved with 2 victims transferring with their military spouses. The other victim PCS'd with her spouse who was deployed at the time the report was made.

The primary impact of COVID on ETs was the need to conduct much of the initial contact virtually. SAPR program personnel initiated various methods to ensure continuity of care and privacy. There were no reports of challenges that degraded services to victims.

6.3 <u>Retaliation Training Definition:</u> How is your Military Service ensuring the DoD SAPRO retaliation definition has been incorporated into annual SAPR training? (OUSD-PR Memorandum, "Defense Sexual Assault Incident Database Updates Involving the Replacement of Lost Forms, Retaliation Reporting, and Electronic File Locker," (October 15, 2019), p. 9)

The Air Force's annual sexual assault training curriculum emphasizes retaliation, prevention strategies, and how to respond to and manage retaliation effectively. The training addresses the Department of Defense's core competencies and learning objectives regarding retaliation and seeks to empower all Airmen so that they fully understand their roles and protections as a victim, witness, or bystander who feels they have been subject to retaliation. Specifically, the training highlights that these individuals have the right to discuss career impacts with a General or Flag Officer if they believe the impacts were due to their report of retaliation or the assistance they provided to the retaliation reporter.

In addition to the training cited in section 6.3 for all personnel, DAF emphasized retaliation information in SAPR training. This content became a focal point for the SARC, SAPR VA, and VVA foundational courses with scenarios and exercises added to practice proper use of the DD Form 2910-2. Additionally, DAF provided retaliation refresher training to all SARCs and SAPR VAs which included guest lecturers from the MAJCOM and DOD Inspector General offices in order to enhance SAPR personnel's understanding of the definitions and key terms associated with retaliation, reporting process, and use and benefits of the Whistleblower Protection Program.

8.1 Analytic Discussion Background

This report contains data about sexual assault crimes that involve at least one Service member (either as the victim or as one or more of the subjects) reported to the Department of the Air Force. Sexual assault reporting data between spouses or intimate partners fall under the purview of the Department of the Air Force Family Advocacy Program and is not included in this report. Data regarding sexual harassment falls under the purview of the Department of the Air Force Equal Opportunity Program and is not included in this report.

Unrestricted and Restricted Report data captures sexual assault reports made by Service members and adult military dependents. The data also includes sexual assaults committed by Service members on victims outside the Armed Forces. Information describing these victims and subjects is also in the following statistics.

Sexual assault data continually changes due to case progress. The data contained in this report is a snapshot, reflecting the status of sexual assault reports, investigations, and subject dispositions in DSAID on September 30, 2020 (the last day of fiscal year 2020).

8.1.1. Sexual Assault Reporting in the Department of the Air Force

The Department of the Air Force received 1,661 reports of sexual assault involving Service members as either victims or subjects in fiscal year 2020. As depicted in Chart 8.1.1., the number of reports received in fiscal year 2020 is similar to the number of sexual assault reports received in fiscal year 2019. The percentage of reports which remained restricted at the end of fiscal year has been increasing since fiscal year 2017. At the end of fiscal year 2020 34% of the reports (566 of 1,661) remained restricted.




Chart 8.1.1. - Annual Reports of Sexual Assault

The Department of the Air Force believes that the sustained high levels of reporting between fiscal years 2014 to 2020 indicates that victims feel increasingly more comfortable in coming forward to report these crimes, receive care, and allow investigations to take place so that commanders and the military justice system can hold subjects appropriately accountable.

The 1,661 reports of sexual assault received by the Department of the Air Force in fiscal year 2020 represent a 1% decrease from the 1,683 reports made in fiscal year 2019; however, this is the second highest number of reports received since the beginning of the SAPR program.

It is important to note that people do not always report sexual assaults in the same fiscal year as they happen, although the majority do. Of the 1,661 sexual assault reports received by the Department of the Air Force in fiscal year 2020, 924 (56%) reported incidents that occurred in fiscal year 2020, 581 reports (35%) were incidents that occurred in prior fiscal years, the remaining 156 reports (9%) were for incidents that occurred on an unknown date.

For comparison, of the 1,683 sexual assault reports received by the Department of the Air Force in fiscal year 2019, 953 reports (57%) were for incidents that occurred in fiscal year 2019, 579 reports (34%) were for incidents that occurred in prior fiscal year, and the remaining 151 reports (9%) were for incidents that occurred on an unknown date.

Types of Sexual Assault Reports: Department of Defense policy allows eligible victims to make either a restricted or an unrestricted sexual assault report. A victim who initially makes a Restricted Report has the option of later converting the Restricted Report to an Unrestricted Report (policy prevents converting an Unrestricted Report to a Restricted Report). Of the 1,661 reports of sexual assault involving Service members as either victims or subjects, the Department of the Air Force received in fiscal year 2020:

- 146 (10%) were Restricted Reports initially reported in fiscal year 2020 that were converted to Unrestricted Reports in fiscal year 2020
- 35 (2%) were Restricted Reports initially reported prior to fiscal year 2020 that were converted to Unrestricted Reports in fiscal year 2020
- 566 (34%) were Restricted Reports initially reported in fiscal year 2020 that remained restricted at the end of fiscal year 2020.

8.1.1.1. Sexual Assault Prevalence in the Department of the Air Force

It is important to draw a distinction between the number of sexual assaults that occur (i.e., sexual assault prevalence) and the number of sexual assaults that are reported to authorities (i.e., sexual assault reporting) in a given timeframe. Since people, in both civilian and military populations, do not report most sexual assaults that occur to authorities, sexual assault prevalence will typically exceed sexual assault reporting.

Sexual assault is a highly underreported crime which means that the number of reported sexual assaults in a given timeframe may not accurately indicate the number of sexual assaults which occurred in that timeframe. To estimate the number of sexual assaults that occur in the active duty Department of Defense population, the Department of Defense administers an anonymous, confidential survey to active duty Department of Defense members biannually. The four most recent Department of Defense sexual assault active duty prevalence surveys were the 2018 and 2016 Workplace and Gender Relations Survey of Active Duty Members, the 2014 RAND Military Workplace Study, and the 2012 Workplace and Gender Relations Survey of Active Duty Members. A prevalence report was not completed in 2020 due to COVID restrictions.

Chart 8.1.1.1, shows the estimated past-year sexual assault prevalence rates (red dots) with 95% confidence intervals (black lines) for active duty Airmen and Guardians from the past four Department of Defense prevalence surveys. According to these surveys, an estimated 3,200 active duty Airmen and Guardians experienced a past-year sexual assault in 2012, decreasing to about 2,300 in 2016, and increasing to 3,900 in 2018.1

¹ The 2012 Workplace and Gender Relations Survey of Active Duty Members used a slightly different measure than did the 2014 RAND Military Workplace Study and the 2016 and 2018 Workplace and Gender Relations Survey of Active Duty Members. The 2012 survey measured unwanted sexual contact, while the 2014, 2016, and 2018 surveys measured sexual assault. Also, the 2012 Workplace and Gender Relations Survey of Active Duty Members used a much smaller sample size than did the 2014, 2016, or 2018 surveys, which is reflected in the relatively large width of the 2012 survey confidence interval compared to the widths of the other survey confidence intervals.




Chart 8.1.1.1. Past Year Sexual Assault Prevalence Estimates for Active Duty Airmen and Guardians

8.1.1.2. Sexual Assault Reporting Compared to Sexual Assault Prevalence

The Department of the Air Force SAPR program has stated a two-pronged goal of reducing sexual assault prevalence while increasing sexual assault reporting. According to the most recent biannual sexual assault prevalence study (the 2018 Workplace and Gender Relations Survey of Active Duty Members), an estimated 3,920 active duty Airmen and Guardians were sexually assaulted in fiscal year 2018. While sexual assault reporting increased between fiscal years 2016 and 2018 by 14%, the estimated prevalence of sexual assault increased by almost 70% over the same time.

Chart 8.1.1.2. illustrates this trend of relatively flat estimated prevalence between fiscal year 2014 and 2016 and increased estimated prevalence in fiscal year 2018 with increased reporting between fiscal year 2016 and 2020 by comparing the estimated number of sexually assaulted active duty Airmen and Guardians in past years to the number of sexual assaults reported by active duty Airmen and Guardians in each fiscal year. However, because the Department of the Air Force accepts sexual assault reports from a much wider population than the population to which the prevalence estimates pertain, not all sexual assault reports are directly comparable to the sexual assault prevalence estimates.²




Chart 8.1.1.2. - Active Duty Prevalence vs. Reporting of Sexual Assault

In fiscal year 2018, the Department of the Air Force received a number of reports equal to approximately 32% of the number of estimated sexual assaults indicated by prevalence studies. This is a decrease from fiscal year 2016 when the number of received reports was equal to approximately 45% of the estimated number indicated by prevalence studies. The Department of the Air Force expects to reduce the "gap" between the survey-estimated number of sexually assaulted Airmen and Guardians and the number of Airmen and Guardians who choose to report in two ways, over time:

- Sexual assault prevention initiatives will reduce past-year prevalence of sexual assault; and
- Initiatives that encourage victims to report and improve the military justice system will increase the number of victims who choose to report.

Although fiscal year 2020 saw the second highest reporting number in the history of the Department of the Air Force SAPR program, about two-thirds of estimated past-year sexual assaults of active duty Airmen and Guardians remain unreported. The Department of the Air

² The sexual assault prevalence studies estimate the number of active duty Airmen and Guardians who experienced a sexual assault in the past 12 months while in military service. The Department of the Air Force accepts sexual assault reports from active duty members of other services, certain non-active duty personnel, and imposes no limit on how long ago the sexual assault occurred or whether or not the victim was in the military at the time of the assault. Therefore, the graphic shows the number of reports

that were by victims who were Service members at the time of the report.

Force continues to strive to narrow the gap between prevalence and reporting in order to reduce the underreporting of sexual assault in the military community.

8.1.2. Unrestricted Reporting

8.1.2.1. Analysis of Victims in Unrestricted Reports with Completed Investigations

This section provides data about victims in completed investigations of Unrestricted Reports of sexual assault. In this section, the term "fiscal year" refers to the fiscal year in which the investigation associated with a report concluded, not the fiscal year of the report of the sexual assault. For example, Unrestricted Reports under the fiscal year 2020 column are not necessarily sexual assaults reported in fiscal year 2020. Rather, they are sexual assault reports whose associated investigations concluded in fiscal year 2020. The dates of these reports were in fiscal year 2020 or in any prior fiscal year.

Type of Offense Investigated: Table 8.1.2.1.1. breaks out the Unrestricted Report investigations completed each fiscal year by type of offense investigated. Military Criminal Investigative Organizations categorize Unrestricted Reports by the most serious offense alleged in the report, which may not ultimately be the same offense for which evidence supports a misconduct charge, if any.

The type of offense investigated in completed investigations has been relatively stable since fiscal year 2016. Penetrating offenses, which include rape, aggravated sexual assault, sexual assault, and forcible sodomy, account for 55% of all completed investigations in fiscal year 2020. Contact offenses, which include aggravated sexual contact, abusive sexual contact, wrongful sexual contact, and indecent assault account for 41% of all completed investigations in fiscal year 2020. Attempts to commit offenses and unknown offense type account for the remainder, approximately 4% of all completed investigations.

Demographic Analysis of Victims in Completed Investigations: Table 8.1.2.1.2. below provides a demographic analysis of victims in investigations completed each fiscal year by gender, age at the time of the incident, military affiliation, duty status, and grade.

Gender: Women consistently represent the large majority (83-88%) of sexual assault victims in completed investigations each fiscal year (2016-2020), while comprising only 20% of the active duty Department of the Air Force population during the same period. Male victims in completed investigations averaged 14% between fiscal year 2016 and fiscal year 2020 while comprising 80% of the active duty Department of the Air Force population during the same period.

Age at Time of Incident: Victims in the 16-19 year age group in completed investigations are over-represented compared to their representation in the Department of the Air Force population. The percent of victims in the 16-19 age group averaged 22% between fiscal year 2016 and fiscal year 2020. In fiscal year 2020, this age group accounts for more than 26% of all victims with investigations completed, while comprising less than 10% of the Department of the Air Force population.

Victims in the 20-24 age group are also over-represented compared with the Department of the Air Force population. Between fiscal year 2016 and fiscal year 2020, the 20-24 age group averaged 41% of victims with investigations completed. In fiscal year 2020, this age group accounted for nearly 45% of victims with investigations, while comprising of approximately 30% of the Department of the Air Force population.

Victims in each of the older age groups are under-represented compared to their respective cohorts in the fiscal year 2020 active duty Department of the Air Force population. In fiscal year 2020 the 25-34 age group represented nearly 16% of victims. In fiscal year 2020 the 35-49 age group represented almost 2% of victims. In fiscal year 2020 the 50+ age group represented far less than 1% of the victims.

Grade: Junior enlisted Airmen and Guardians (E1-E4) are over-represented as victims in completed investigations between fiscal years 2016 and 2020 averaging 62% of completed investigations. In fiscal year 2020, junior enlisted Airmen and Guardians (E1-E4) accounted for 76% of victims in completed investigations while comprising 39% of the active duty Department of the Air Force population. Senior enlisted Airmen and Guardians (E5-E9) and officers each account for a smaller share of the victims in completed investigations (15% and 6%, respectively, in fiscal year 2020).

Expedited Transfers: Table 8.1.2.1.4. provides a summary of expedited transfer requests by Service member victims. The number of expedited transfer requests in fiscal year 2020 was 213, of which 6 were denied. Expedited transfers were denied due to the victim pending Uniform Code of Military Justice actions, victim pending separation, the alleged offender no longer being assigned to the base, or the Commander determined that the report was not credible. The number of transfer requests was comparable to fiscal year 2019, but these two years represent an increase from all previous years.

8.1.2.2. Analysis of Subjects in Unrestricted Reports with Completed Investigations

This section analyzes demographic data about subjects in completed investigations of Unrestricted Reports of sexual assault. In this section, the term "fiscal year" refers to the fiscal year in which the investigation associated with a sexual assault report concluded. For example, Unrestricted Reports under the fiscal year 2020 column are not necessarily reports filed in fiscal year 2020. Rather, they are sexual assault reports whose associated investigations concluded in fiscal year 2020. These reports include those filed in fiscal year 2020 or in any preceding fiscal year. Additionally, while each Unrestricted Report of sexual assault has a single victim, a report may have more than one subject. For these reasons, the number of subjects shown in a given fiscal year will not necessarily match the number of Unrestricted Reports with completed investigations during that fiscal year.

Demographic Analysis of Subjects in Completed Investigations: Table 8.1.2.2.1. provides a demographic analysis of subjects in investigations completed each fiscal year by gender, age at the time of the incident, military affiliation, duty status, and grade.

Gender: The majority of subjects in completed investigations are male. The percentage of subjects in completed investigations that are male has remained relatively stable during the last five fiscal years, at approximately 84%. Men comprised about 80% of the active duty Department of the Air Force population during this time.

Compared to their share of the active duty population, women are under-represented as subjects in completed investigations. In fiscal year 2020, women represented about 6% of subjects in completed investigations while comprising 21% of the active duty Department of the Air Force population.

Age: On average between fiscal year 2016 and fiscal year 2020, the leading age groups of subjects in completed investigations are age groups 20-24 at 39%, 25-34 at 28%, and 16-19 at 10%. In fiscal year 2020, the leading age groups of subjects in completed investigations were similar to the five-year averages.

Grade: On average between fiscal year 2016 and fiscal year 2020, the grade groups of subjects in completed investigations are E-1 to E-4 at 63%, E-5 to E-9 at 28%, O-1 to O-3 at 5% and O-4 to O-10 at 3%. In fiscal year 2020, E-1 to E-4 remained the rank group with the highest percentage of subjects in completed investigation at 67%.

8.1.2.3. Investigative and Military Justice Process Discussion

Subject Dispositions: Once the investigation of an Unrestricted Report is complete, Congress requires the Military Services to provide the outcome of the allegations against each subject named in an investigation. There were 508 subject investigations with disposition information to report in fiscal year 2020. Of those, 113 subjects were outside of the Department of Defense's legal and jurisdictional authority, and a civilian or foreign authority exercised jurisdiction over 4 service member subjects. Table 8.1.2.3.1. illustrates that, of the remaining 391 subjects with reportable fiscal year 2020 disposition data, 278 were held accountable by Command. Command action was precluded with respect to 111 subjects largely because either the victim declined to


participate or there was insufficient evidence of any offense. Commanders found sufficient evidence to support sexual assault or other misconduct charges against 71% of subjects who were under the jurisdictional authority of the Department of Defense.

Completed Command Actions: Chart 8.1.2.3.2. analyzes completed command actions for penetrating and sexual contact crimes over time. Command actions for non-sexual assault offenses increased by four percentage points between fiscal year 2019 and 2020. Command actions for sexual assault offenses that led to discharge or other administrative actions reverted to previous trends in percentage terms (7%). Command actions for sexual assault offenses that led to non-judicial punishment doubled in percentage terms over fiscal year 2019, while command

actions leading to Court-Martial charges increased by 6 percentage points over the same time. Cases where command action was not possible decreased by 6 percentage points between fiscal years 2019 and 2020.



*NOTE: This figure only includes command actions in which the action was completed in FY 2020. Command actions pending completion (e.g., court-martial preferred but pending trial) are not included in this graph. Additionally, there were 9 completed command actions that could not be classified as penetrating or sexual contact crimes because the crime charged was attempted sexual assault.

Court-Martial Outcomes: Charts 8.1.2.3.3. and 8.1.2.3.4. respectively provide sexual assault Court-Martial outcomes for penetrating and sexual contact crimes over time. Of the 104 total subjects, 45 subjects proceeded to trial in fiscal year 2020. Ten of these were convicted of a penetrative offense and six were convicted of a contact offense, for an overall conviction rate of 36%.




Chart 8.1.2.3.3. – Sexual Assault Court-Martial Outcomes for Penetrating Crimes




Chart 8.1.2.3.4. - Sexual Assault Court-Martial Outcomes for Sexual Contact Crimes

Duration of Investigative and Military Justice Processes

The length of a sexual assault investigation depends on a number of factors, including:

- The alleged offense;
- The location and availability of the victim, subject, and witnesses;
- The amount and kind of physical evidence gathered during the investigation; and
- The length of time required for crime laboratory analysis of evidence.

Depending on these and other factors, sexual assault investigation length may range from a few months to over a year.

Chart 8.1.2.3.5. shows the mean and median lengths of time to complete sexual assault investigations in the Department of the Air Force. The median length of investigation decreased between fiscal years 2019 and 2020 while the mean time slightly increased.




Chart 8.1.2.3.5. – Average Sexual Assault Investigation Length

Chart 8.1.2.3.6. shows the mean and median number of days from when a victim files an Unrestricted Report (i.e. signs the Department of Defense form 2910) to the completion of the Courts-Martial process, sentencing or acquittal. In fiscal year 2020, the median time from filing an unrestricted sexual assault report to completion of the Courts-Martial process was 24 days less than in 2019.




Chart 8.1.2.3.6. – Days from Filing of Unrestricted Report until Courts-Martial Outcome

Chart 8.1.2.3.7. shows the mean and median number of days from when a victim files an Unrestricted Report (i.e. signs the Department of Defense form 2910) to completion of non-judicial punishment actions. In fiscal year 2020, the median time between filing an Unrestricted Report and completion of the non-judicial punishment decreased by 12 days from fiscal year 2019.




Chart 8.1.2.3.7. – Days from Filing of Unrestricted Report Until Non-Judicial Punishment Outcome

8.1.2.4. Analysis of Incident Details in Unrestricted Reports

Table 8.1.2.4.1. analyzes incident details associated with Unrestricted Reports of sexual assault by the fiscal year in which the Department of the Air Force received the sexual assault report rather than the fiscal year in which the investigation and outcome was completed as in previous sections of this report. Whereas previous sections classified unrestricted sexual assault reports by the fiscal year in which the associated investigation was completed, this section classifies sexual assault reports by the fiscal year of the filing of the report. In cases where investigations are not complete, the information provided by the victim is the basis for incident details. Table 8.1.2.4.1. does not include any sexual assault reports that were initially filed as restricted in one fiscal year but converted to unrestricted in a later fiscal year. However, it does include any sexual assault reports initially filed as restricted in one fiscal year and converted to unrestricted in the same fiscal year.

The overall number of Unrestricted Reports made to the Department of the Air Force decreased by 6% from fiscal year 2019 to fiscal year 2020, from 1123 in fiscal year 2019 to 1060 in fiscal year 2020.

Assault Location: The percentage of Unrestricted Reports in which the sexual assault occurred on base increased for the first time since fiscal year 2017, increasing from 43% in fiscal year 2019 to 51% in fiscal year 2020.

Subject-Victim Service Affiliation: Unrestricted Reports in which Service members sexually assault non-Service members has remained relatively constant between 12 and 13% in fiscal years 2017 and 2020. Unrestricted Reports in which non-Service members sexually assault Service members remained relatively constant at 5% between fiscal years 2018 and 2020.

Subject-Victim Gender: The percentage of Unrestricted Reports involving subjects and victims of different genders (i.e., males sexually assaulting females or females sexually assaulting males) increased by six percentage points, from 62% in fiscal year 2019 to 68% in fiscal year 2020. Conversely, the percentage of reports involving subjects and victims of the same gender (i.e., males sexually assaulting other males or females sexually assaulting other females) decreased by two percentage points, from 10% in fiscal year 2019 to 8% in fiscal year 2020.

Reporting Delay: The percentage of Unrestricted Reports filed within 30 days of the occurrence of the sexual assault stayed constant between fiscal year 2019 and 2020 at 46%.

Assault Day of Week and Time of Day: The percentage of Unrestricted Reports in which the sexual assault occurred on the weekend (Friday through Sunday) decreased between fiscal year 2019 and fiscal year 2020 from 60% to 57%. The percentage of Unrestricted Reports in which the sexual assault occurred between midnight and 6AM has stayed relatively consistent since fiscal year 2016 between 45% and 50%. In fiscal year 2020, 50% of the reported sexual assaults occurred between midnight and 6AM.

8.1.3. Restricted Reporting

Restricted Reports of sexual assault are confidential, covered communications as defined in Department of Defense policy. The Department of the Air Force cannot investigate allegations made in Restricted Reports because there is no requirement for victims to provide many details about these sexual assaults and SAPR personnel do not enter information about alleged subjects into DSAID. Therefore, the DSAID data on Restricted Reports is more limited than data on Unrestricted Reports.

8.1.3.1. Restricted Report Conversions

Table 8.1.3.1.1. shows the number of initially Restricted Reports, the number of initially Restricted Reports those victims converted to unrestricted in the same fiscal year, and the number of Restricted Reports remaining restricted at the end of each fiscal year.

In fiscal year 2020, 712 victims initially filed Restricted Reports with the Department of the Air Force. Of these, 146 chose to convert their Restricted Report to an Unrestricted Report in fiscal year 2020 (the unrestricted reporting sections include these reports), leaving 566 Restricted

Reports remaining restricted at the end of fiscal year 2020. The percentage of Restricted Reports that were converted decreased by 4 percentage points between fiscal years 2019 and 2020.

8.1.3.2. Analysis of Victims in Restricted Reports

Table 8.1.3.2.1. and the following discussion provides a demographic analysis of victims of sexual assault who made Restricted Reports that remained restricted through the end of the reporting fiscal year, without conversion. The unrestricted reporting section above includes converted Restricted Reports.

Gender: The portion of male and female victims in Restricted Reports remained consistent between fiscal years 2019 and 2020. The percentage of victims making a Restricted Report in 2020 who were male was 20%; this is higher than the portion of victims making Unrestricted Reports in 2020 who were male (12%).

Age at Time of Incident: There is little variation between the age distribution of individuals making Unrestricted and Restricted Reports. Victims in the 16-19 age group accounted for 24% of the Restricted Reports and 26% of Unrestricted Reports in fiscal year 2020. Victims in the 20-24 age category accounted for 43% of the Restricted Reports and 45% of the Unrestricted Reports in fiscal year 2020.

Grade: Officers make up a higher proportion of Restricted Reports compared with Unrestricted Reports. The proportion of officers making a Restricted Report in fiscal year 2020 was 10% compared with 6% of the Unrestricted Reports. Senior enlisted Airmen and Guardians (E5-E9) also make up a higher proportion of Restricted Reports compared with Unrestricted Reports. Senior enlisted Airmen and Guardians make up 24% of the Restricted Reports in fiscal year 2020 compared with 15% of the Unrestricted Reports.
